This certificate is presented in recognition of the Burrowes Mansion Ribbon Cutting Ceremony and 50th Anniversary of the Matawan Historical Society. Built in 1723 the Burrowes Mansion was the home of "The Corn King," John Burrowes. The first company of New Jersey militia formed for the Revolutionary War was mustered by his son, Maj. John Burrowes Jr., right in this home's garden. Today the Burrowes Mansion on Main Street in Matawan has been completely restored and is the home of the Matawan Historical Society. Matawan's Revolutionary War and Historic Sites include: Burrowes Mansion, Philip Freneau House, Philip Freneau Gravesite, Hawkins Hunn House, and Mt. Pleasant Cemetery.
